You are about to purchase a product that is not simple and may be difficult to understand.

1. What is this product?

Type English law governed equity-linked notes / Return depends on the performance of the underlying / Partial capital protection up to 35.00% against market risk

Term The product has a fixed term and will be due on 26 June 2030, subject to an early redemption.

Objectives The product is designed to provide a return in the form of a cash payment on termination of the product. The timing and amount of this payment will depend on the performance of the **underlying**. The payment at maturity will not exceed EUR 1,280.00. If, at maturity, the **final reference price** of the **underlying** has fallen below 65.00% of the **initial reference price**, the product may return less than the **unit reference amount** or even the minimum payment amount of EUR 350.00.

(Terms that appear in bold in this section are described in more detail in the table(s) below.)

Early termination following an autocal: The product will terminate prior to the **maturity date** if, on any **autocal observation date**, the **reference price** is at or above the **autocal barrier price**. On any such early termination, you will on the immediately following **autocal payment date** receive a cash payment equal to the applicable **autocal payment**. The relevant dates and **autocal payments** are shown in the table(s) below.

Termination on the maturity date: If the product has not terminated early, on the **maturity date** you will receive:

- if the **final reference price** is at or above the **initial reference price**, a cash payment equal to EUR 1,280.00;
- if the **final reference price** is at or above 65.00% of the **initial reference price** and below the **initial reference price**, a cash payment equal to EUR 1,000.00; or
- if the **final reference price** is below 65.00% of the **initial reference price**, a cash payment directly linked to the performance of the **underlying**. The cash payment will equal (i) the **unit reference amount** multiplied by (ii) (A) the **final reference price** divided by (B) the **initial reference price**. However, if this cash payment is less than EUR 350.00, you will receive EUR 350.00 (the minimum payment).

Under the product terms, certain dates specified above and below will be adjusted if the respective date is either not a business day or not a trading day (as applicable). Any adjustments may affect the return, if any, you receive.

The product terms also provide that if certain exceptional events occur (1) adjustments may be made to the product and/or (2) the issuer may terminate the product early. These events are specified in the product terms and principally relate to the **underlying**, the product and the issuer. The return (if any) you receive on such early termination is likely to be different from the scenarios described above and may be less than the amount you invested.

You do not have any entitlement to a distribution from the **underlying** and you have no right to any further entitlement resulting from the **underlying** (e.g., voting rights).

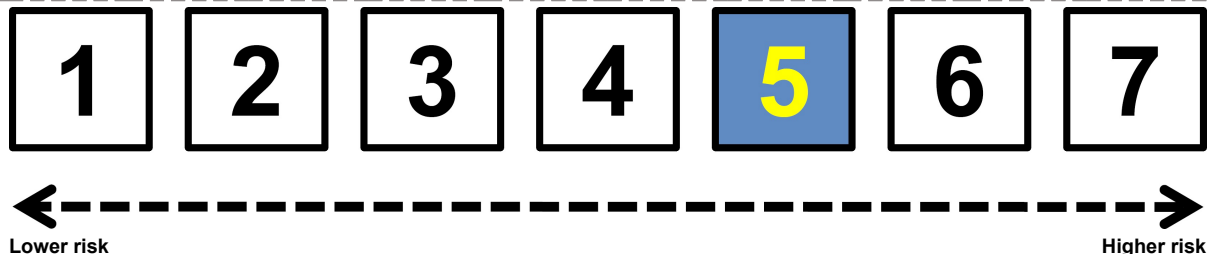

Intended retail investor The product is intended to be offered to retail investors who fulfil all of the criteria below:

1. they have the ability to make an informed investment decision through sufficient knowledge and understanding of the product and its specific risks and rewards, either independently or through professional advice, and they may have experience of investing in and/or holding a number of similar products providing a similar market exposure;
2. they seek capital growth, expect the movement in the underlying to perform in a way that generates a positive return. They have a medium investment horizon and understand that the product may terminate early;
3. they are only able to bear a partial loss of their initial investment, consistent with the redemption profile of the product at maturity (market risk);
4. they accept the risk that the issuer or guarantor could fail to pay or perform its obligations under the product irrespective of the redemption profile of the product (credit risk);
5. they are willing to accept a level of risk of 5 out of 7 to achieve potential returns, which reflects a medium-high risk (as shown in the summary risk indicator below which takes into account both market risk and credit risk).

2. What are the risks and what could I get in return?

Risk indicator



The risk indicator assumes you keep the product until 26 June 2030. The actual risk can vary significantly if you cash in at an early stage and you may get back less. You may not be able to sell your product easily or may have to sell at a price that significantly impacts on how much you get back.

The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you.

We have classified this product as 5 out of 7, which is a medium-high risk class. This rates the potential losses from future performance at a medium-high level, and poor market conditions are very unlikely to impact our capacity to pay you.

To the extent the currency of the country in which you purchase this product or your account currency differs from the product currency, please be aware of currency risk. You will receive payments in a different currency so the final return you will get depends on the exchange rate between the two currencies. This risk is not considered in the indicator shown above.

Inflation erodes the purchasing value of cash over time and this may result in the decline in real terms of any capital reimbursed.

You are entitled to receive back at least 35.00% of the unit reference amount. Any amount over this, and any additional return, depends on future market performance and is uncertain. However, this protection against future market performance will not apply if you cash in before maturity or in case of immediate termination by the issuer.

The favourable, moderate, unfavourable and stress scenarios represent possible outcomes that have been calculated based on simulations using the past performance of the **underlying** over a period of up to 5 years. In the case of an early redemption, it has been assumed that no reinvestment has occurred. The stress scenario shows what you might get back in extreme market circumstances. This product cannot be easily cashed in. If you exit the investment earlier than the recommended holding period, you do not have a guarantee and you may have to pay extra costs.

3. What happens if the issuer or the guarantor is unable to pay out?

Costs over time

The tables show the amounts that are taken from your investment to cover different types of costs. These amounts depend on how much you invest, how long you hold the product and how well the product does. The amounts shown here are illustrations based on an example investment amount and different investment periods.

The duration of this product is uncertain as it may terminate at different times depending on how the market evolves. The amounts shown here consider two different scenarios (early call and maturity). In case you decide to exit before the product ends, exit costs may apply in addition to the amounts shown here.

5. How long should I hold it and can I take money out early?

Recommended holding period: 4 years

The product aims to provide you with the return described under "1. What is this product?" above. However, this only applies if the product is held to maturity. It is therefore recommended that the product is held until 26 June 2030 (maturity), although the product may terminate early.

The product does not guarantee the possibility to disinvest other than by selling the product off-exchange, where an offer for such product exists. In such circumstances, the price quoted will take into account any costs incurred by the issuer and/or the manufacturer associated with the early unwinding of the product. In addition, the person who sold you the product may charge you brokerage fees when you sell the product (see section "4. What are the costs?"). By selling the product before its maturity, you may receive back less than you would have received if you had kept the product until maturity.

In volatile or unusual market conditions, or in the event of technical faults/disruptions, the purchase and/or sale of the product can be temporarily hindered and/or suspended and may not be possible at all.
